Review: last year's aims and outcomes

Progress in Reading	Using end of Spring 2020 mock SATs results and teacher PITA due to Summer 2020 COVID-19 school closures, our one disadvantaged pupil was GDS at the end of KS1 and high EXP Spring 2020 so made just below expected progress.
Progress in Writing	Using end of Spring 2020 mock SATs results and teacher PITA due to Summer 2020 COVID-19 school closures, our one disadvantaged pupil was EXP at the end of KS1 and EXP Spring 2020 so made expected progress.

Progress in Mathematics	Using end of Spring 2020 mock SATs results and teacher PITA due to Summer 2020 COVID-19 school closures, our one disadvantaged pupil was EXP at the end of KS1 and EXP Spring 2020 so made expected progress.
Phonics	Using Spring 1 mock PSC and Spring 1 RWI assessment due to Summer 2020 COVID-19 school closures, 0/1 disadvantaged children met the standard. 2020 Year 2 PSC was N/A because all 4 Year 2 disadvantaged children met the standard in the 2019 Year 1 PSC.
Other	Up until the Summer 2020 COVID-19 school closures, 2019-20 attendance of disadvantaged pupils was slightly above 96% (96.41%).
