GEOGRAPHY: This term we will be studying, comparing and contrasting localities: Exeter, Paris and Mexico. We will be locating and discussing the physical and human features of each locality as well as learning about how topographical features and land-uses have changed over time.





ENGLISH: This Summer term, we will be Reading and Writing a range of genres including fiction, non-fiction and poetry. We will use images and literature as a starting point for our Writing and will be focusing on Narrative including Setting and Character studies. Guided Reading is continuing with the popular novel 'Rooftoppers' by Katherine Rundell. Spelling and Grammar work will be daily as well as threaded into our Reading and Writing. Year 6s are continuing to prepare for their SATS.



RE: RE this term will study what is important to Humanists including comparing with Christianity, finding value in both and making links to our own lives.





PSHE: In PSHE we will learn about 'Being My Best' which will include discussing aspirations and goals and how to achieve them. We will also be learning about well-being issues which affect young people today.

SCIENCE: This term we will be learning to identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system as well as describe their functions using a real pig's heart. We will be carrying out investigations into the effect of exercise on our hearts and pulse rate and discussing the effects of smoking, drugs and alcohol on our bodies.







Summer Term - Kestrels

Welcome to the Summer Term! We have lots of exciting learning planned this term including dissecting and labelling the parts of a pig's heart, continuing with our fabulous class story 'Rooftoppers', preparing for Sport's Day and exploring Surrealism! Watch out for our Art Gallery which will be open to parents/carers to showcase our learning! The children will also enjoy enrichment trips such as a trip to Newquay Zoo and of course, Beach Day (hoping for more settled weather this year!). For our RSE (Relationships, Sex Education) we will be looking at 'Growing and Changing' as well as having workshops on keeping safe with the NSPCC.


ART: Art will be exploring 'Surrealism' including studying some influential artists and sculptors from the movement.
