Maths As mathematicians, we will explore place value, the four operations and fractions. We will also be practising our timetables everyday to help with fluency. RE In R.E. this term, we will be answering these BIG questions: 'How do festivals and family life show what matters to Jewish people?' and 'Why is the Torah so important to Jewish people?'. We will explore core Jewish beliefs, celebrations and key stories and texts to help us answer these BIG questions.
