



SPORTS PREMIUM 2021-22

What is the Sports Premium Grant?

The government has provided funding of £150 million per annum since the academic years 2013/14 to provide substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses of the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE.
- New or additional Change4Life sport clubs.
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport.
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport.
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games.
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/sport.
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and residential visits.

How do we intend to spend the 2021-22 sports funding?

Employ a specialist Sports Teacher/Coach to coordinate & support the delivery PE across the School.

She will support Teachers to ensure a broad, varied & inclusive curriculum for all pupils to access. Support staff to plan and deliver quality PE sessions. She will provide feedback from CPD training for teachers to ensure that they can develop their own knowledge and understanding of activity areas to improve confidence when teaching PE. In addition, offer guidance & support to teaching staff where needed. She will ensure that resources for staff are up to date and suitable for pupil progress. She will coordinate (through a PE specific calendar) extra-curricular opportunities for pupils to ensure participation in a range of sports, activities and events.

External CPD opportunities for staff.

Where required staff will access specific CPD opportunities for themselves, sharing resources and equipment with other members of staff.

Membership of the sporting networks associated within the area.

This is to ensure that we can access support, training and collaborative ideas for staff when teaching PE. To allow pupils to access a wide range of festivals, competitions and events against/with other schools.

Participation in cluster events led by feeder secondary schools.

To allow pupils to access a wide range of festivals, competitions and events against/with other schools. To forge links with Sports teachers & coaches in the local secondary schools to help staff at primary improve their PE & sports provision.

Purchasing new equipment.

To ensure that all pupils have access to suitable equipment that will enable them to become physically literate.

Provide places for pupils in lunchtime and after-school sports clubs.

We will offer a range of sports clubs that all pupils can be part of to increase the number of those pupils being involved in physical activity.

Ensure there are a range of sporting activities and competitions for pupils to be part of.

To increase opportunities for our pupils with sporting talents to train and compete with pupils of a similar standard.
