Reading – Children are expected to read 5 x per week with an adult. Please can you make a record in their reading record which needs to be sent into school each day. They will have a book bag book to read to you and a library book to share with you at home.

Spelling – Children will have a selection of words to learn each week at home, which they will be expected to apply in their writing. Choose 5 at a time to learn from the appropriate year group list.

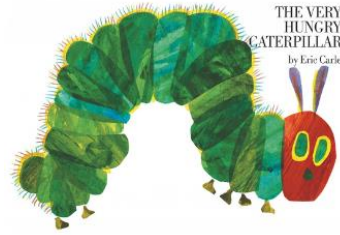
Times tables – Children are expected to learn to count in 2's, 5's and 10's in year 1 and then apply this in year 2 to knowing their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. All children have access to Times Tables Rockstars to allow them to practise at home.

Homework projects: Activities and projects will be set termly. Homework projects consolidate learning taking place in school. Studies have shown that home learning can be extremely important in a child's cognitive development. It has been proven that your engagement at home with your child's home learning accelerates their progress.

Project 1 – Art
